  - (1) Facilitate cooperation on smart cities development.
  - (2) Catalyse bankable projects with the private sector.
  - (3) Secure funding and support from the ASEAN's external partners.
- The "ASCN" is designed to allow member cities to focus on areas that matter to them, in line with each city's local and cultural context, such as transport, water quality, energy, health care, education, public services, data, and ICT.
