

Participants from JICA Projects of Jordan and Tanzania Studied Minato Mirai 21

UR held lectures and site-visits about the Minato Mirai 21 for eleven Jordanian participants of JICA Project on Updating Aquba Special Economic Zoon (ASEZ) Master Plan on Aug 28, and fifteen Tanzanian participants of JICA Project fon Oriented Development for Dar es Salaam on Sep 13.

JICA Jordan project is to update the master plan to promote sustainable growth of ASEZ, an economic and tourism hub on the Red Sea. Minato Mirai 21 has many offices, including the headquarters of leading companies, in addition to tourist attractions and famous hotels. Therefore, participants felt that there



were points to refer to when updating their master plan. In this regard, they asked details of land use restrictions and the role of UR in development.

On the other hand, Dar es Salaam in Tanzania has been constructing Bus Rapid Transits (BRT) and plans to develop along BRT and around new stations. There is a space at Minato Mirai 21, which enables to access to various facilities from directly the sta-



tion. Participants got tips for their project. they showed strong interest in economic impact of the project and asked how to attract Japanese companies.

Both days were hot, but participants went around Minato Mirai 21 by bus and walked through Queen mall, main pedestrian walkway. We are supporting developing countries by UR's various knowledge and technology through JICA programs.
