

Indonesia Land Bank Authority Delegation Visits UR

On April 7, 2026, a delegation of approximately 20 members from the Indonesia Land Bank Authority (the Land Bank), led by Mr. Hakiki Sudrajat, Acting Head of the Land Bank, paid a courtesy visit to the Urban Renaissance Agency (UR). The delegation was received by Mr. Honiden, Associate Vice President for Global Affairs of UR.

The Land Bank is a special agency established by the Government of Indonesia, with special authority to guarantee the availability of land for public interests, social interests, national development interests, economic equality, land consolidation and agrarian reform.

As part of bilateral cooperation, an expert dispatched from UR as a JICA specialist has been providing advice on the application of urban development systems and methodologies. The visit reflects the delegation's keen interest in Japan's urban development and land-use practices, particularly UR's approach to large-scale urban development projects.

Following opening remarks by Mr. Honiden and Mr. Hakiki, the two sides engaged in an exchange of views on their respective organizational initiatives, experiences, and approaches to urban development.

UR subsequently presented an overview of the project background and key planning features of the Minato Mirai 21 district, where UR implemented a land readjustment project. The delegation then conducted an on-site visit, observing urban development initiatives carried out collaboratively by UR, the City of Yokohama, and private-sector partners. These included the integrated development of public transportation infrastructure (the Minato Mirai Line) and major commercial facilities such as Queen's Square Yokohama.

Members of the Land Bank, including Mr. Hakiki, expressed strong interest in UR's proven ability to deliver large-scale, long-term projects in a stable and consistent manner, even amid changing socioeconomic conditions, as demonstrated by the Minato Mirai 21 project.

UR will continue to deepen its collaboration with Indonesian partners while expanding opportunities for Japanese companies to engage in overseas projects.
